



NATIONAL WOMEN'S GOLF TOURNAMENT RULES AND GUIDELINES

1. ELIGIBILITY:
 - A. Entries are open to women amateur golfers whose names are on their local chapter Current handicap system of record.
 - B. Players are required to be on said roster two (2) months prior to the National Tournament.
2. HANDICAPS:
 - A. Players must have an established current handicap index per the handicap system of record.
 - B. This handicap index is based on the ten (10) current annual rounds of Southern Chapters tournament golf and members of Northern Chapters must have an established handicap of seven (7) rounds of tournament golf sanctioned by their local chapter as per NPAGA Constitution and NPAGA By-Laws. (Section 4 B/2)
3. ENTRY FEE:
 - A. Woman golfer will pay entry fee as established per host city and as per NPAGA Constitution and NPAGA By-Laws.
4. ROUNDS OF PLAY:
 - A. Play will be as per NPAGA Constitution and NPAGA By-Laws.
5. TYPE OF TOURNAMENT:
 - A. Type of tournament will be thirty-six (36) holes-stroke play.
6. FLIGHTS
 - A. Will be set up by host city with a minimum of 2 flights.

7. RINGS/TROPHIES

- A. All rings and trophies will be provided by the host city and awarded on Friday by the host city and National Tournament Chairman (Amended-Oklahoma, July 27, 2006)
- B. Low net score in each flight will receive a ring and a trophy.
- C. All prizes, rings and trophies shall be equivalent to the men's.

8. EVENT OF TIES:

For Ring and Trophy (All Flights)

- A. Champion determined as per NPAGA Constitution and NPAGA By-Laws using handicap to determine the winner.

For Trophies (All Flights)

- B. Playoff will be off score cards as per NPAGA Constitution and NPAGA By-Laws using handicap to determine the winner.

9. GOLF COURSES:

- A. Golf courses will be at the discretion on the host city.
- B. Thursday and Friday will be the days of play.
(Amended – Oklahoma, July 27 2006).

10. DEADLINE:

Deadline for entering the National Tournament will be the same as in any National event during said week.

11. RULE OF PLAY:

USGA rules will govern play. Local course rule will also be followed.
