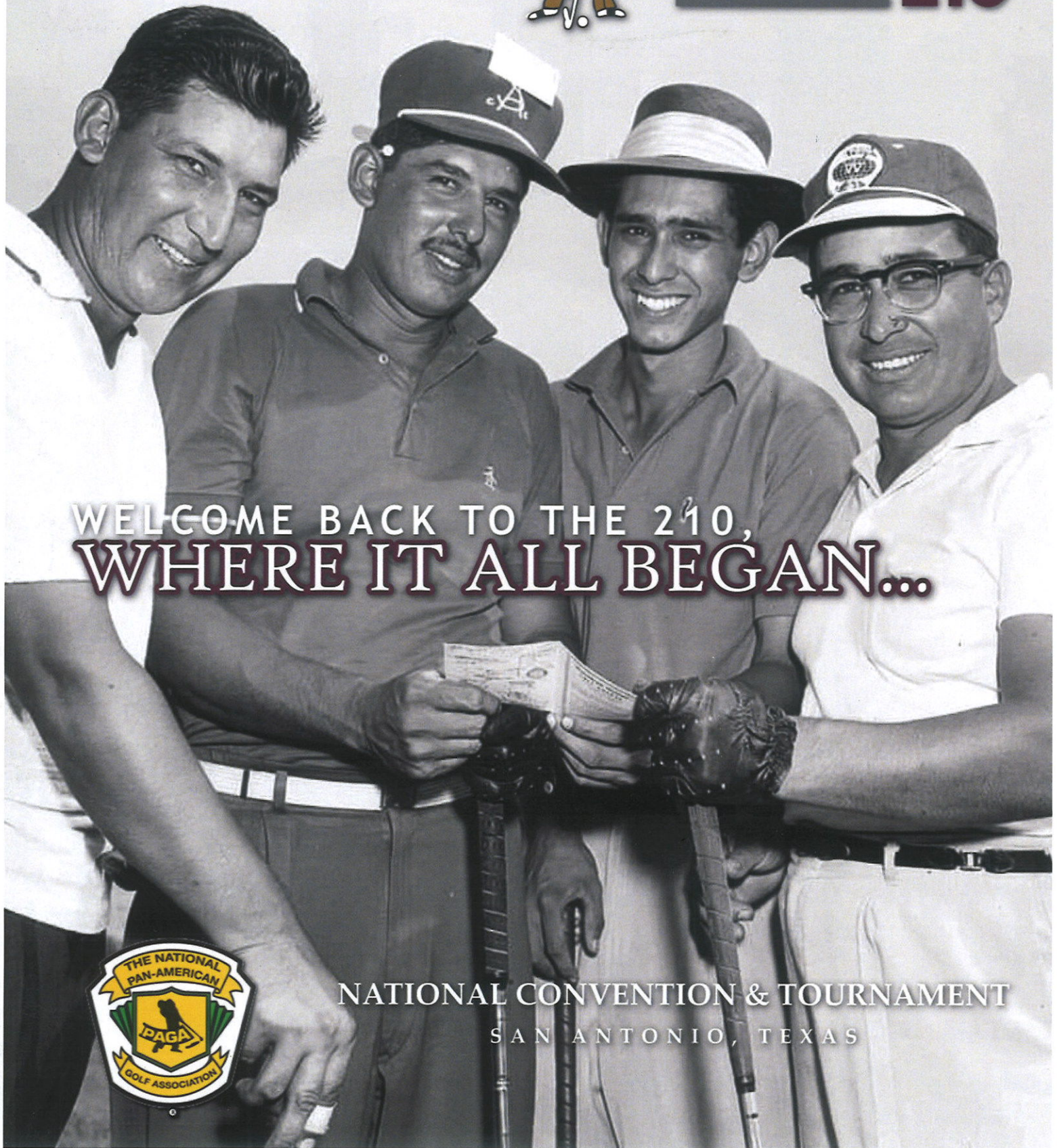

There seems to be a lot of double entries in the system.

As most of you have found out you are no longer allowed to enter manual scoring. We are trying to keep on eye on this to help eliminate those who enter non tournament scores. Only PAGA sanction tournaments scores can be used for startershack and count towards your qualifying rounds.

Looking at this year Team Competition we had 9 flights. It is hard enough for chapters to fill a 7 man team and the by-laws state you need one from each flight to be able to qualify. I feel a discussion needs to be had to go back and call it a 7 man team instead of team competition to help other chapters getting a team in.

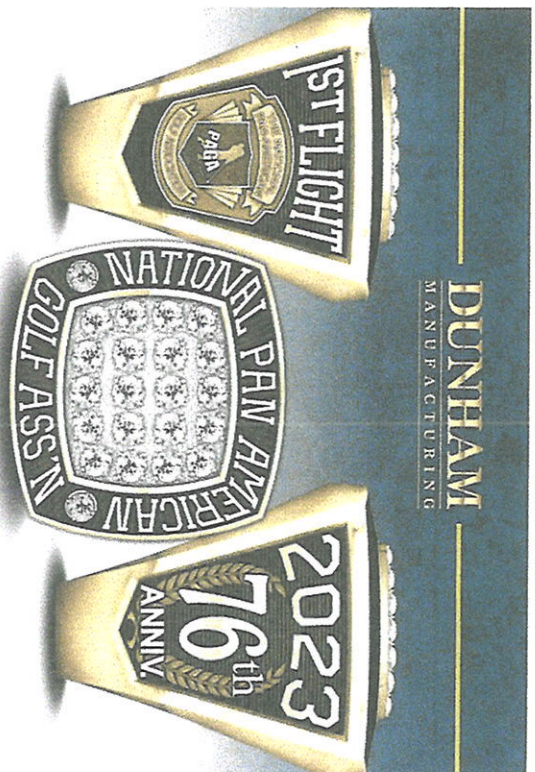

BY-LAWS OF THE NATIONAL PAN AMERICAN GOLF ASSOCIATION

SECTION 3. DUTIES OF THE NATIONAL OFFICERS *continued*:

Treasurer – The Treasurer shall be responsible for all the Organization funds and present a financial statement to the Board of Directors as often as the Board may direct. He will receive all **Income** for deposit and substantiate financial reports at all general, special and delegate meetings, and will keep accounts of all assets including all materials and equipment. The Treasurer shall be bonded. Two signatures will be required on all checks coming out of the National Treasury. Three (3) signatures will be on file at the bank, any two (2) of which can be honored. The signatures will be those of the President, Vice President and Treasurer.

Tournament Director – The National Tournament Director shall be in charge of all National Handicap Meetings, seeing that each chapter has complied with the Constitution and its By-Laws for tournament play. He shall maintain a current roster and handicap of each individual in each chapter. He shall be responsible for posting with Handicap Service Provider the scores of all the flight winners of the National Tournament.

The National Seniors Committee (Amended ended 3-24-90) – This committee shall consist of P.A.G.A. members that are at least fifty (50) years of age and are in good standing. This committee will be in charge of placing and directing all activities for the other members of all Senior Committees. This committee shall have its own Chairman and any sub-committee needed. The National Seniors Committee shall have a representative at all Board and National Meetings and will be required to report their activities to the assemblies of all National Meetings.

Past Officers – All immediate past National Officers will remain active and responsible until the end of that calendar year in an advisory capacity.

SECTION 4. QUALIFICATIONS TO COMPETE AT THE ANNUAL NATIONAL TOURNAMENT Qualifying dates for the National tournaments begin July 1st of the current year and end June 30th of the following year.

CHAPTER'S RESPONSIBILITY (Amended August 3, 1993)

- 4. All chapters must ~~submit twelve (12) calculations per year. Chapters can only submit to enter their member scores in the Handicap Service Provider used by the NPAGA. All scores must be posted with in 5 days of the event one (1) calculation (Handicap Service Provider posting sheet) per month, with a maximum of four (4) tournament rounds sanctioned by the local chapter per member. Calculations must be submitted after Annual National Tournament and no later than thirty (30) days prior to the next annual Qualifying rounds must be entered by June 30 to qualify for the current year's National Tournament. 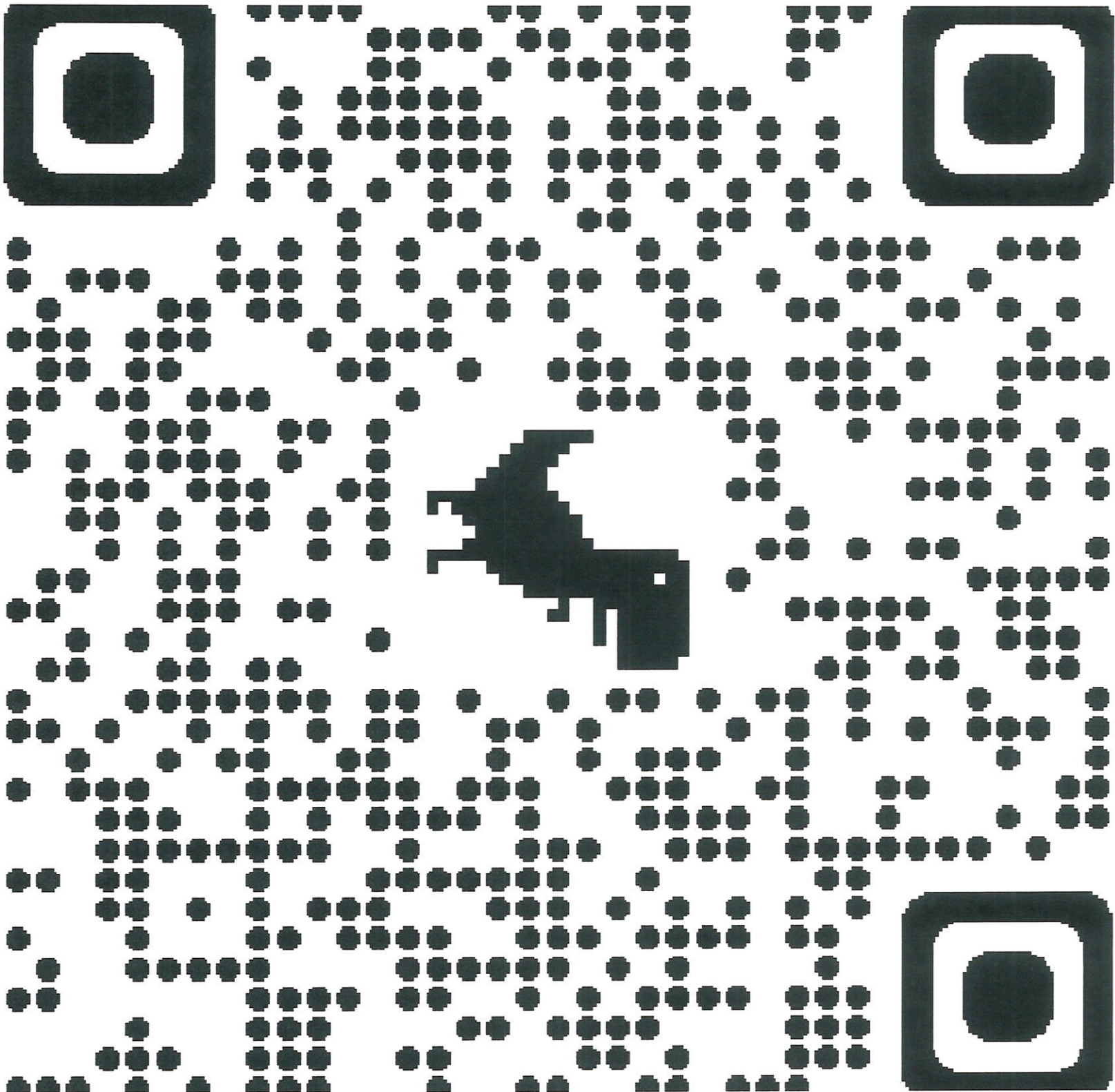

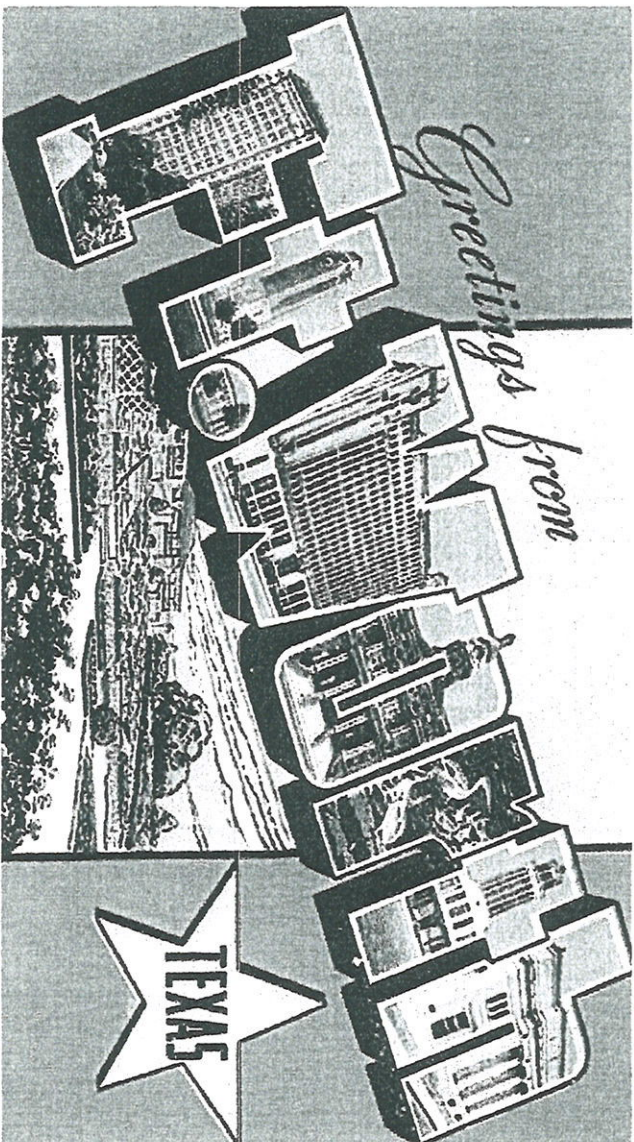

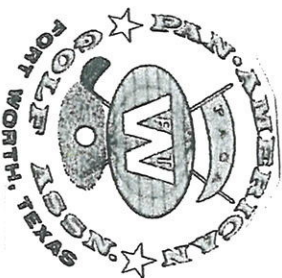

NATIONAL PAN AMERICAN GOLF ASSOCIATION (NPAGA). The first chapter of the National Pan American Golf Association was founded in San Antonio in 1938 but under a different name. In January 1938, five Hispanics who lived in San Antonio met in the upstairs office of physician Juan Rivera to found an association of local Hispanic amateur golfers. His office was located above the Socorro Drug Store in what is now known as the historic El Mercado area of San Antonio. The attendees at that first meeting decided to invite fifteen additional Hispanic golfers to become charter members. The group's purpose was to provide golf competitions and a social network for its members.

Originally, the organization was known as Fore Golfers. Brackenridge Park Golf Course was the organization's home course. By the spring of 1938 the number of members had grown to more than a hundred. The meetings were moved to the Mexican Christian Institute, located at 1214 Colima Street (the site of the Human Christian Center in 2018).

Although the Brackenridge Park Golf Course was a public, city-owned course, there were still some vestiges of racial discrimination in the late 1930s. Alexican Americans were not allowed to participate in city amateur sports events in that era. Also, the city of San Antonio would not rent the course to the Hispanic group unless the organization prepaid the rental fee. Cruz Lozano, the owner of a local metapackaging company, loaned the new association \$900 in order to reserve tee times and prepay rental fees for the association's tournaments at Brackenridge. During World War II the association's tournaments and other activities were suspended. Many members served in the military during the war. After the war, some golfers from Seguin joined the San Antonio organization.

In 1947 Claude Estrada, a member of Fore Golfers, suggested changing the name of the group to the Pan American Golf Association (PAGA). The proposed name was adopted.

The first satellite chapter of PAGA was established by the early 1950s, after member Raul Sandoval moved his business from San Antonio to Corpus Christi in June 1950. PAGA's then-president, Al Zepeda suggested that Sandoval organize a chapter in Corpus. Before long other chapters were organized in Austin, Dallas, Fort Worth, and Houston.

In 1953 PAGA member Tony Holguin won the Texas Open Tournament (known as the Valero Texas Open in 2018) and became the first PAGA member to win a PEGA Tour event. In 1956 the PAGA chapters began a series of statewide tournaments, and two years later those events became official championship tournaments. In the decades of the 1960s and 1970s, the PAGA grew to become a national organization (NPAGA) with more than thirty chapters. The group also initiated a junior golf program.

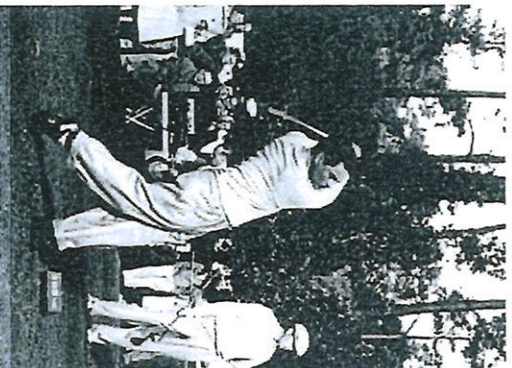
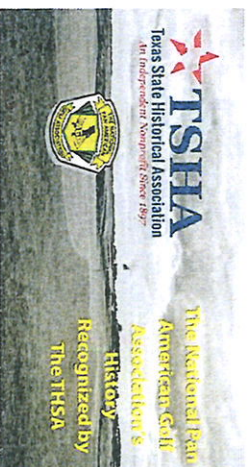
In the 2010s the NPAGA has become the largest Hispanic golf organization in the United States, with more than forty-three chapters in nine states and more than 2,600 members. In addition to the many chapters in Texas cities, chapters in other locations include Pomona, California; Detroit, Michigan; Chicago, Illinois; Phoenix, Arizona; and Kansas City, Missouri. Over several decades, the organization has awarded thousands of scholarships. The San Antonio chapter, located at 2300 Avenue B, also houses the National PAGA archives.

Antonio "Tony" Arredondo parlayed luck and skill to excel in golf, gaining a reputation as a top gun gambler.

It started when his uncle, Victor Muñoz and two sons Fred and Andy, who were constructing Colonial Country Club in 1936, brought home clubs and balls, and introduced his nephews Tony and David to the game. Tony relished playing at 5 years old, swinging the club in two empty lots across from his home at 1515 E. Weatherford.

Tony's parents landed jobs for the teen brothers as caddies, earning \$1 per bag carried, at Glen Garden Golf & Country Club. In 1950, Tony caddied for Byron Nelson, whom he admired for his superb play and gentleman's demeanor. While Nelson received a millionaire's son, Tony came from a working-class family. Nelson invited Tony to the game. Eight years later, when Tony joined a Dallas Country Club, Nelson recognized and chatted with him like they were old acquaintances.

The 34-year-old's impressive swing caught Rockwood Golf Course manager-pro Clarence "Skeet" Fricker's eye. The pro told Tony he could play as often as he wished at Rockwood without paying, mentored his game, and gave him a wedge club. After unsuspecting men played against Tony, Fricker said, "I told you. You couldn't beat my boy."

As Tony's game improved, so did his confidence. The once shy, humble youth grew into a better gambler, betting \$10 per hole on amateur prizes. When Fricker offered Tony a job as a caddy, Tony declined. He wanted to play. When four Dallas golfers gambled, they needed to be followed to clubhouse. Tony, he called a sponsor, who drove to the course in his Cadillac and parked on an overlooking hill. As the patrons ran down the hill to hand him the money, the Dallas men stood stunned at the exchange, quickly realizing wagers were about to go up.

After another golfer lost to Tony at Rockwood, he remarked in the clubhouse in the presence of other golfers the Mexican kid couldn't play at any other Fort Worth course. Tony challenged him to a second game and left that day with \$275 of the loser's cash stuffed in his pockets.

Raised in a family of nine children to Mexican immigrant parents, Tony felt compelled to contribute to their financial security. At Ernest Parker Jr. High School, a coach advised him to enroll in Peralta High School to play on its golf team and probably garner college offers. Like many Fort Worth Latino youth of the 1950s, he planned on securing quickly a full-time job. He attended Trimble Technical High School, learned printer's skills, and landed well-paying employment in a union shop.

Pursuing his golf passion in his free time, Tony competed in tournaments throughout Fort Worth. He played mostly par golf, but rose to competitive challenges, scoring in the low 80s. When the Pan American Golf Association formed in 1951, Tony joined as the youngest member of the Latino golf club.

Tony won several Fort Worth Pan American tournaments and experienced the club in state-wide Pan American games. He felt particularly proud of winning the Fort Worth Press annual tournament at Worth Hills Golf Course in 1962. After the city of Fort Worth sold the course to Texas Christian University for the school's expansion, he jokingly commented it closed because an Hispanic won.

Despite encouragement to turn pro, Tony, now 85, refused to gamble leaving his wife and children at home alone.
